

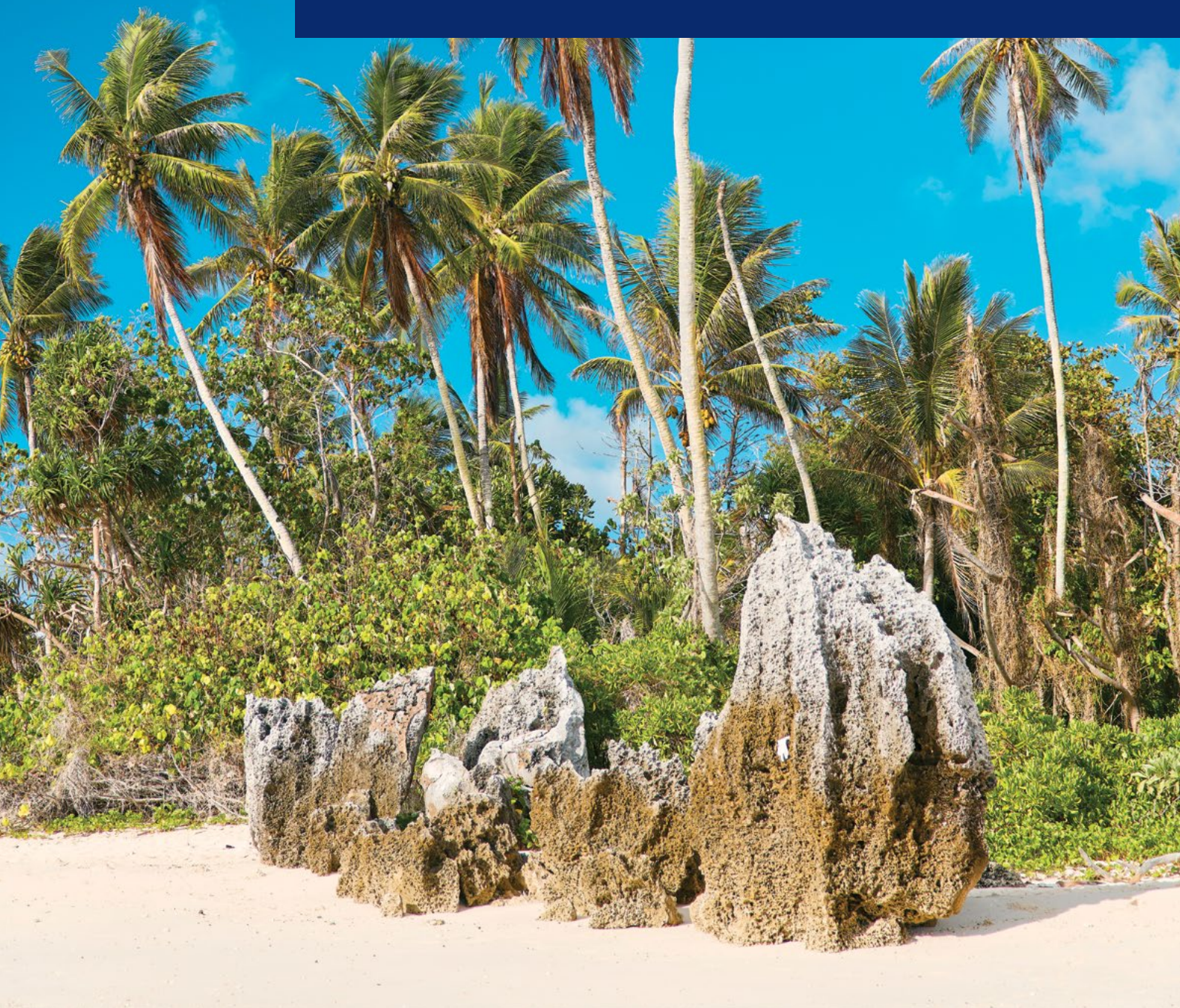

Contribution Option

The Naoero Economic and Climate Resilience Citizenship Program offers a straightforward pathway to citizenship through a direct contribution to the Treasury Fund of Naoero. For a Principal Applicant, the contribution amount is USD 115,000. A limited-time offer of USD 90,000 will be available under a special project for applications received by 31 December 2026. An additional fee of USD 2,000 applies for each dependent, and an additional sibling of the Principal Applicant or their spouse may be included for USD 15,000.

Your contribution will enable the Dei-Naoero government to fund various development projects, potentially including climate resilience initiatives, infrastructure improvements, renewable energy projects, and sustainable economic diversification efforts. By contributing to Naoero, you are securing citizenship as well as playing a part in the nation’s sustainable development.

USD 90,000 for the Principal Applicant (limited time offer available until 31 December 2026)



USD 15,000 of an additional sibling of the Principal Applicant or their spouse



USD 2,000 for a each additional dependent, aged 16 and above

Application fee

- USD 5,000 for the Principal Applicant
- USD 2,000 for each additional dependent, including siblings of the Principal Applicant or their spouse

Due diligence fee

- USD 6,000 for the Principal Applicant
- USD 3,000 for each additional dependent, aged 16 and above
- USD 3,000 for a benefactor

Bank due diligence fee and transaction charge:

- USD 1,200 for the Principal Applicant
- USD 1,700 for a Principal Applicant with up to three dependents
- USD 2,200 for a Principal Applicant with four or more dependents
- USD 1,000 for a benefactor

Passport fee

- USD 500 per passport, to be paid to the Naoero Government



Application Process and Eligibility

Applying for the Naoero Economic and Climate Resilience Citizenship Program is a structured process, guided by licensed Agents and the Naoero Program Office. It begins with an initial consultation with an Agent, followed by document preparation and application submission. Applicants undergo thorough due diligence checks and are required to attend an online interview. Upon approval, applicants make the required contribution, take the Oath of Allegiance to Naoero, and receive their certificate of citizenship and Dei-Naoero passport.

To be eligible for the Naoero Economic and Climate Resilience Citizenship Program, applicants must be of good character, with no criminal record, pass rigorous due diligence checks, have the financial capacity to make the required contribution, and principal applicants must be at least 18 years of age. Additional requirements include providing a police clearance certificate and demonstrating that you are not a potential threat to national security.

Process

- 1 Contact an Agent for eligibility assessment
- 2 Agent gathers and submits required documents and fees
- 3 Application undergoes government and international due diligence checks
- 4 Attend an interview (virtual or in-person)
- 5 Application reviewed, approved, and contribution made
- 6 Take the Oath of Allegiance
- 7 Receive citizenship certificate and Naoero passport

The process typically takes three to four months.

The nation's maritime territory presents opportunities for investment and development, particularly in areas such as sustainable fishing and maritime infrastructure.
